

# Traveling With Your Guide Dog In-Training Check List


## Before you leave on a trip:

- 1) File a travel request with your leader (for either driving or flying).
- 2) If traveling by plane need a Health Certificate too.
- 3) Make sure your travel request has been approved BEFORE you leave.
- 4) If request for traveling with GDB puppy is refused for this trip, make arrangements for a GDB puppy sitter.
- 5) If leaving puppy with a puppy sitter, complete form "Puppy Goes to Sitter" and give to sitter.

## **\*\*WHILE TRAVELING WITH GDB PUPPY YOU MUST HAVE:\*\***

- 1) A copy of your GDB puppy's Certificate of **\*Rabies Vaccination**
  - a. This can be obtain from vet free of charge if you didn't receive one the day your puppy got his/her rabies shot at 4 months.
- 2) **\*Shot History** (Puppy shots, + Bordetella-if female)- good idea to always carry this list with puppy ID card.  
**\*Call the vet ahead when requesting a copy of rabies vacation and shot record for your trip. Be polite when requesting this information and give Vet's office a few days notice.**
- 2) **ID** from Guide Dogs for the Blind with Puppy's tattoo number.
- 3) **Vet Form**

## **Puppy Supplies DON'T FORGET THEM**

- GDB Jacket
- Food for entire trip (zip lock bags work great)
- Bowl
- Kennel 
- Leash (Not kidding people have forgotten the leash before, how I have no idea.)
- Training equipment (headcollar, slip collar, training collar, tie down, etc. as needed)
- Clean-up Kit (bags, carpet cleaner, etc.)
- Water Bottles (very important to keep puppy hydrated)
- GDB approved toys (all kids need their toys,  
but at least puppy will not keep asking, "Are we there yet!")
